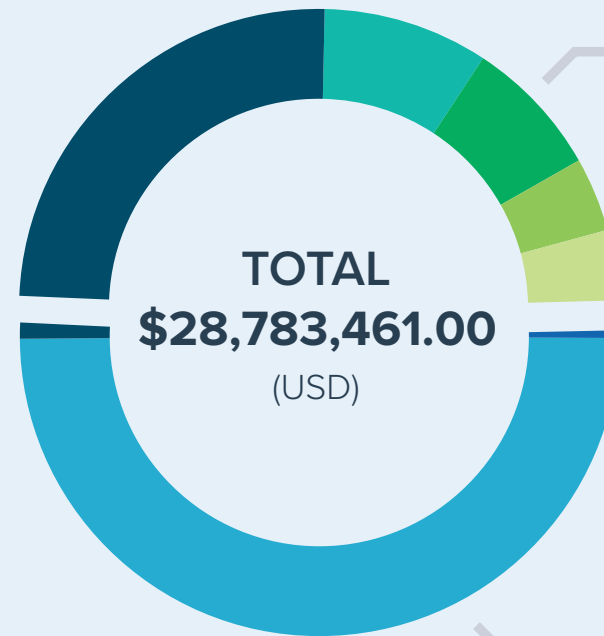




## Introduction
